PRESENT PERFECT VS PAST SIMPLE

Past Simple (used for completed actions at a specific time in the past)

- I visited Paris last year.
- She studied English in 2020.
- They went to the party yesterday.

Present Perfect (used for actions that happened at an unspecified time or have a connection to the present)

- I have visited Paris. (No specific time)
- She has studied English for five years. (Still happening)
- They have gone to the party. (Focus on experience, no time mentioned)

EXPRESSING PREFERENCE

1. "Prefer" (General Preferences)

Structure: prefer + noun/gerund (verb + -ing) +(to)+ noun/gerund

Example: I prefer tea to coffee. / She prefers reading to watching TV.

2. "Would Prefer" (Specific Situations)

Structure: would prefer +(to)infinitive + rather(than) + base verb

Example: I would prefer to stay home rather than go out.

3. "Would Rather" (Specific Situations, More Informal)

Structure: would rather + base verb + than + base verb

Example: I would rather stay home than go out.
